BENEFITTING THE REHABILITATION OF THE JAMES ROSE CENTER**

The James Rose Center is a 501 C3 non-profit educational foundation headquartered at the Ridgewood, New Jersey former home of modernist landscape architect, James Rose. **THE TOUR AND RECEPTION WILL FEATURE:**

- A guided tour of local, undocumented residential gardens designed and constructed by Rose
- Transportation from the James Rose Center to each of the residential gardens listed on the tour
- A guided tour of James Rose's Ridgewood home highlighting the restoration efforts at the Center
- A catered reception and celebration featuring live entertainment
- Continuing education credits offered to landscape architects by the James Rose Center

**LOCATION & TIME:**

- The guided tour and reception will be offered Saturday, June 5<sup>th</sup>
- Participants will meet at 12:00 noon in the parking lot of the Ridgewood High School located immediately across the street from the James Rose Center.
- The tour is expected to conclude by 4:00PM at the James Rose Center with a grand reception and celebration.

**EVENT DETAILS:**

- This event will offer an opportunity to contribute to the rehabilitation of this historic landmark, which has been recognized by the American Society of Landscape Architects with prestigious awards, including the Centennial Medallion and Classic Award.
- The reception will feature the exhibition and finalists from the juried competition "Suburbia Transformed, One Garden at a Time: Exploring the Aesthetics of Landscape Experience in the Age of Sustainability."
- The tour of all gardens will be lead by Dean Cardasis, FASLA.

**COST:**

- The registration fee for the guided tour, lecture, continuing education credits, and reception is \$150/person or \$125/person for NJASLA members who register at the annual conference.
- Any proceeds will benefit the restoration efforts of the James Rose Center.
